PORT WELSHPOOL & DISTRICT MARITIME MUSEUM.

AS Christmas comes closer each day so do the invites to celebrate the festive season. We consume alcohol in proportions that we don't necessarily have during the year. With the days of NO random breath testing and NO blood alcohol limit for drivers, well in the past, we now take advantage of the courtesy bus supplied by most venues all in the name of staying safe and keeping clear of the blue light flashing behind us. And with this necessary pleasure we live to tell the tale.

THE HOTEL, a place of community gatherings, mainly for the blokes. For the ladies, they had the 'Ladies Lounge" to consume their drop. Ladies not being allowed to be with the men in the bars, but, the men were allowed in the lounges.

Ladies had a small window to purchase a drink where they could observe the goings on in the bar. You had to peer through the haze of cigarette smoke to try and get your mans attention. Many a night ended with a few of the males talking with their fists. Doesn't it bring a smile to your face as you remember then and compare it with now.

The Museum once traded as a "Wine Saloon". The entrance for the saloon was the second door at the front of the building. The shelves are still there that housed the bottles of alcohol, but sadly the counter is long gone, due to an infestation of borer. A curtain hand painted with roses once hung down over the counter at closing time. Little is known of the museums history as a wine saloon, other than Mrs Smith snr having a small revolver to protect herself against unwanted intruders, while her husband was away fishing. Whether she ever had to use it, is unknown, no gun licensing laws in those days and "women" carrying guns!

Desperate measures for desperate times I guess.

Newspaper reports from local papers report that Mr & Mrs Smith were both charged the sum of 25 pounds for selling sly grog at the fishermen's jetty.

Whether the wine saloon closed for family reasons or because of the opening of the Welshpool Hotel, it is yet to be discovered.

This is another little treasure of history all within the Museum.

With Santa soon to come down the chimney, the Committee and Members of the Museum would like to wish everyone a safe and happy festive season and hope you pay us a visit during the Sea Days Festival weekend for an old fashioned Devonshire Tea or Spider [not the creepy type] and a wander around your museum.

Twenty Seven applications were received for this round of community grants.
