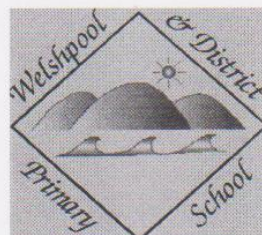

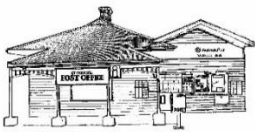

The Wireless.... Once one of the most important items in the home.

It was the entertainment for the music we enjoyed, as we sang along to that voice of all voices and the laughter we gave as we listened to the comedy shows. The Goons, Dad and Dave or Spike Milligan to name a few, were a favourite to many, as the comedians went through their antics and entertained us with their silliness.

Maybe it was a serial we listened to daily, many a mum would not miss "Blue Hills" or "When Portia faces life" all with their defining music so you know that the next exciting episode was about to begin.

The News was another memory, announcers with their strong voices and the music that was a key piece to the news, we knew it was 12noon.

This piece of furniture took pride of place in our homes and kept us in touch with all that was happening around the world. The announcement of war was a milestone in our lives. The Wireless kept us up to date with the devastation this brought and also the announcement of it ending and to know the joy of the troops coming home.

The Wireless came in all shapes and sizes, usually one per house, "the floor model" in the lounge or maybe you preferred "the table model".

As technology progressed we saw Bakelite in all colours, then there was the radiogram where you could play your favourite music on the vinyl records, time after time and we sang along "like no one was listening", and you hoped no one was.

For the folk of Port Welshpool, the wireless was a very important part of life. With a turn of a knob you could listen on short wave to the "Ship to Shore". This station allowed wives, girlfriends, mothers and children to know the whereabouts of their loved ones. For the fishermen, they all kept in contact, not only to know where the fish were being caught but also for the weather, or for the price catches were bringing at market. And just in case you were in trouble you always like to know who could be at hand to help. Callers on the radio all made contact by calling under the name of their boat, e.g. "Plover to Mary Norling". The crew all knew each other and the boats name also defined the Port in which she berthed. Radios were always turned on, with all on board with one ear trained to listen in case one of the Ports fleet should call for a chat or a boat nearby was in trouble. Manly boats were named after females, a mother, wife, daughter, or sister. The men spent so many days at sea, the name of the boat was a reminder of the connection with the land. Not all boats were named after family members, some had quirky names like the "Whodunit". It was always a bit of a giggle to listeners when the "Whodunit" called up! Many boats were also names after males, and today it would have been interesting to know the reaction when the "whodunit" called up but at the time the girls caused the giggle.

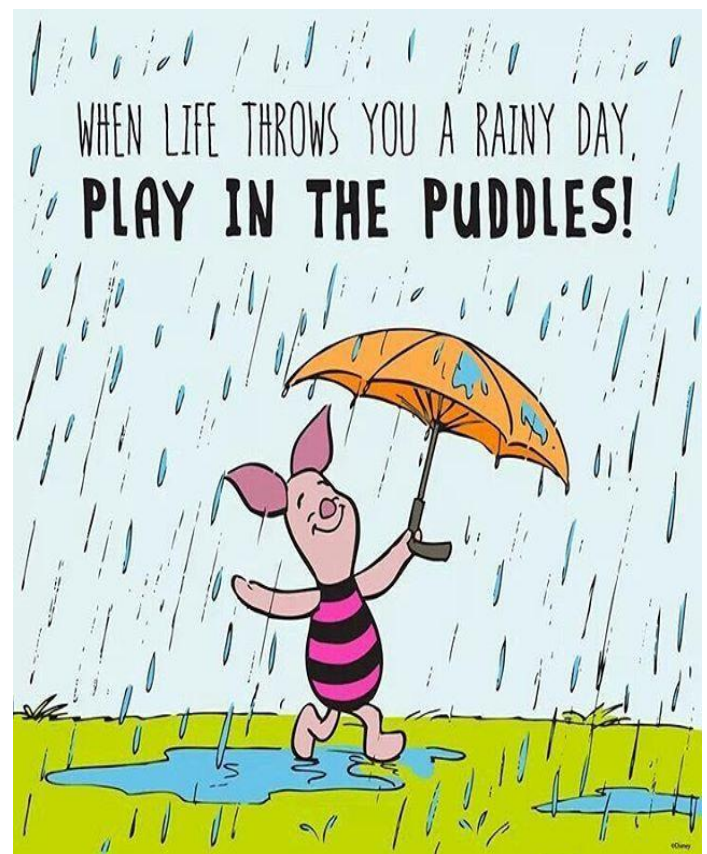

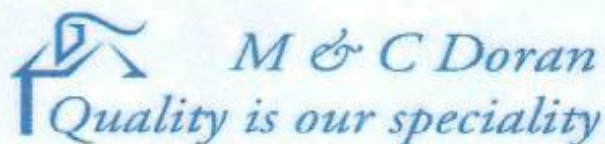

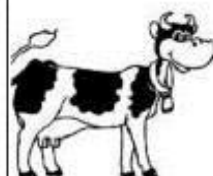
