

## Port Welshpool & District Maritime Museum

THE HOUSE......Rented or owned. It didn't matter it was "Our Home". In today's standards it was simple but that was what we could afford, and that was where mum made it special. With her touch of likes to make it comfortable and "Ours". The Kitchen had its wood stove from which all the gourmet delights came. Some we loved and others we hated. The kitchen was the hub of the house, where a few arguments started, whose turn was it to wash up or dry? The invention of dish drainers helped a bit but not all mums liked the dishes sitting there drying, but then the opinions of an argument and free drying, the dish drainer won. The kitchen table was where everyone gathered at meal time, dad at the end, as the head of the house. This was where you learnt table manners and how to set a table. Where grace was said before a meal and you asked to be excused from the table when finished.

How simple were the house plans, three **bedrooms**, if you were lucky or maybe the veranda built in to create a bedroom when that unexpected baby arrived. Boys in one room and girls in the other. Two to a bed, or maybe three, some wetting the bed, others not. Babies shared with parents. Clothes being shared by everyone. Didn't like a garment, too bad, not an option, but then on the other hand you didn't care just glad to be warm. How special were "hand me downs", from other families, so special. **Toilet** in the house? No, half way up the backyard out of sight. In front of the toilet door for privacy was a small fence with a creeper growing over it to give the image of something nice. But then there were "gozunders". Thank goodness for the invention of septic tank and the inside toilet.

The **bathroom** as we knew it was very simple, a bath, hand basin and cupboard. Baths weren't had every day and the invention of the shower came later with the more modern brick veneer homes and the connection of mains water. As you were relying on Mother Nature to fill the tanks for your water supply and for this reason water was not wasted. "Watch out for the wrigglers"! A good wash was all that was needed or APC as it was affectionately known.

The flower **garden** was at a minimum at most houses. Plants that were self-sufficient and grown from cuttings or self-seeding were the go, as money was at a minimum and so was time. Mum had enough to do in the house. Besides we didn't have plant nurseries anywhere near, so cuttings we could share with friends or neighbours was the deal. Rain gave the garden a drink or grey water from the dishes and bath, as the tank water was needed for everyday living and who knew when it would rain.

The shed, well, that was a story in itself. Everything was stored in there. Just in case "You may need it one day!" No Bunnings to nick up to or MITRE 10, no just dads shed. Improvise was the name of the day or recycling as we know it today. Not because it was good for the environment but out of necessity. The odd mouse and many a spider made dads shed their happy home too.

At Christmas time we decorated our homes with whatever was available, creating decorations from whatever we could find. No plastic Christmas trees, we had the real thing. The smell of pine filling our happy homes as we needed this image to welcome Santa as we knew it wouldn't be long and he would be coming down the chimney.





## PORT WELSHPOOL MARINE PRECINCT PLAN

The Port Welshpool Marine Precinct Plan aims to both revitalise the region and township through foreshore enhancement and marina development as well as provide important safety improvements to marine infrastructure.

The plan will ensure user safety with the separation of commercial and recreational users with room to expand the commercial port. It is expected to improve visitor experiences, especially with the Port Welshpool Long Jetty to be completed in 2018.
