Dr. Tim Edwards, Head of VCA workshops, travelled from Melbourne to judge the inaugural Garden Sculpture section.

A big thank you to all in the community that supported the show this year. It was a record show for the Horticultural Society.






# Welshpool & District Playgroup

**Remember,** when the jingle for a ladies retail outlet was.... "This goes with that at Suzanne's". There was a time when this didn't have to go with that.

This got me thinking, as I was reminded recently how you didn't have to have the right saddle to ride your horse, that is, if you were lucky enough to have a saddle. Bare back was the norm or the good old spud bag. We used whatever was available and I am sure some of you have seen some very clever creations. No one was judgemental of your creation, nor were you embarrassed. You were usually congratulated as this was when you used your grey matter and it was expected of you, as "money didn't grow on trees", nor was there a "bottomless pit in the back yard."

It was also the adventure of learning life.

The hessian bag was a must in every house and there always seemed to be plenty, but of course as potatoes were a stable part of our diet, they went with every meal. They were also easy to grow, popping up in the chook yard after the kitchen scraps were fed to them. Nothing wasted. If you were lucky enough to have a car, a hessian bag was handy in case you got bogged or you would

see some firewood to collect.

In the Janet Iles one was used to keep the fish caught cool. A wet bag over the fish box did the job, as with the tide and wind swinging the boat around, even when anchored, you couldn't always rely on the shade.

Back at home the "Dunny Can Man" arrived with one over his shoulder, "to catch spills." At the back door of your home, you wiped your feet on one before entering the house.

You carried your rabbits, fish, and crayfish home in them. Now we are using fabric bags, once again, including hessian. Around we go......

Dry bags for insulation and wet bags have also been known to act as an air conditioner. Haven't we come a long way? But I bet along the way modern day inventions have been modelled on this simple use of this strong versatile fabric. One thing is for sure, we can relax as the "Dunny can man" won't be back. Imagine in today's climate with all the rules and regulations! I would imagine he would have to be suited up as if he was going to the moon, not to mention the certificates he would have to hold for the job.

As a kid, fancy dress was where the hessian bag come in handy again, with many a costume being made from them. Storage in dad's shed, they were always a must, and where many items got misplaced.

Onion bags were another well used bag we recycled for many uses, but I feel the hessian bag seemed to have more uses because of its dense weave and type of fabric. Just the same the onion bags weren't discarded as everything was recycled where possible.

I can also tell you a true story of mutton birds being smuggled passed a "Fisheries Games Inspector" who had come down the jetty to inspect a boat after a day out fishing. This was usually for undersize fish, but at the time it was mutton bird season. These birds were banned from collection in Victorian waters.

The boat had only been out for the day with the intention of fishing and getting some birds. The fisherman had arranged with his wife, along with baby in the pram, to come down the jetty to meet the boat just in case the inspector was on duty. On seeing the inspector coming down the jetty, the contraband was hidden in a hessian bag and stashed under baby's mattress. To make the getaway the fisherman staged an argument, as planned with his wife, who promptly stormed off in a huff, along with baby and mutton birds, passed the inspector. By the way, no under size fish were on board.

Writing this my mouth is watering at the thought of cooked mutton birds.






