

Port Welshpool & District Maritime Museum

Shopping revisited....As we continue our shopping spree of old we cast our memories back to the township full of small businesses all proudly displaying their wares. As you entered the town it was very obvious as to who was selling what, not like now with shops with their catchy names. The business were proudly named either with the owner's family name, as some of these businesses had been in the one family for generations or by the towns name.

The "Welshpool Bakery" comes to mind. Bread from the bakery was delivered to the "Blayney's General Store", at the port and of what a great memory this has. We had bread; the shape and the size were the difference. Gluten free, low G.I., among many...never heard of them and we didn't have plastic bags, no, just a piece of tissue paper wrapped around the middle secured with sticky tape. As we left the shop and made the "slow walk home"....we picked at the warm crunchy crust. We didn't need to be told what the ingredients were, we knew....Yummy! So much so that none was wasted, if it managed to become stale it could always be made into bread and butter pudding or fried bread, now there are some memories for the taste buds.

The "Welshpool Butchers", was another that delivered to the port. Phone your order through or just drop in a written order and on Friday there it was left at the door or in our case on the window sill under the verandah. All was safe. The best was visiting the shop, with the sawdust on the floor and the butchers in their striped or white aprons covered in blood. No hats or gloves, we trusted their hygiene. The best part came when the meat was wrapped in the "butchers'" paper and the butcher tied the string around the parcel and then applied "his magic" with a knot and a snap of the wrist the string was broken. No scissors or knife needed.

Some shops had a curious paying system. Mainly Co-Op's and Haberdashery shops. After selecting your article/s a docket was hand written out and the required amount of money along with the docket was put in a capsule and sent to the office for all to be checked, with the ring of a bell it flew along a wire at ceiling height, the office girl would check all in the capsule and return it with the required change. The office girls responsibility. The design of the offices were like a glassed in elevated room so they could look down on the shop floor, you wonder to watch the staff or keep an eye on shoppers in case of theft. Probably both, but just the same jobs were plentiful. No experience needed, just the will to work as the pride of each business came with training. "Remember the customer is always right".
