

Scholarship program to benefit local youth

The Llew Vale Scholarship is offered annually by the Community Bank Toora & Foster to support local students in achieving their academic and career dreams. Two Promontory District secondary school students will benefit from our Scholarship program again this year, supplementing their study costs in the first and second years of their higher education, whether it be at University or TAF:

Sue Pilkington, Chair of the Community Bank Toora & Foster said "Our annual Scholarship program is an investment in the future of younger members of our community. The cost of higher education when you live in a rural area far exceeds that of students in metropolitan areas attending a local University or TAFE. It's not just fees. When you factor in the extra cost to a rural family of having a student live away from home this Scholarship makes a difference by relieving some of the costs faced by students".

"The Community Bank Scholarship Program is a transformative undertaking. It can change the lives of local students, providing opportunity for higher education that might not have otherwise been possible. It's a tangible example of how banking with us strengthens our community".

Successful Scholarship applicants will initially receive funding for one year. Successful completion of the <u>first year</u> results in funding to assist in the second year of their study.

Applications are now invited from eligible students who intend to commence tertiary or TAFE studies in 2026. Applications open on 15th September 2025 and close on 23 January 2026. All applications are assessed in early February 2026.

Last year, the Llew Vale Scholarship offered by the Community Bank Toora & Foster supported local students Zoe Greenway and Sage Anderson. Zoe is studying for a Bachelor of Secondary Education degree at Federation University and Sage for a Bachelor of Science degree at Monash University.

Zoe says "My first semester at university has been full of new friends and new experiences. It has been a great time and I can't wait for more."

Sage says "I'm honestly loving university so far, there are so many friendly people and the content has been really interesting and engaging. I feel like my gap year has really set me up for balancing a study and my own life and I'm looking forward to seeing what the rest of the year takes me!"

The Llew Vale Scholarship offered by the Community Bank Toora & Foster is part of the Bendigo Bank Scholarship Program, which focusses on supporting regional, rural, Indigenous and agricultural students. The program has been running since 2007, investing more than \$13.4 million in supporting the tertiary education of more than 1984 students across Australia.







Christmas Pudding BonBons



Ingredients Serves: 30

For the Bonbons

- 125 grams best-quality dark chocolate (finely chopped)
- 350 grams cooked and cooled Christmas pudding
- 60 millilitres sherry
- 2 tablespoons golden syrup

For the Decoration

- 100 grams white chocolate (finely chopped)
- 6 red glace cherries
- 6 green glace cherries

Method

- 1. Line a baking sheet (that will fit in the fridge) with clingfilm, baking parchment, foil or Bake-O-Glide, and set it to one side while you make the bonbons.
- 2. Melt the dark chocolate in a heatproof bowl suspended above a pan of simmering water, or in the microwave according to the manufacturer's guidelines.
- 3. Crumble the cold Christmas pudding into a bowl, add the Pedro Ximénez sherry and golden syrup and stir briskly till all is incorporated.
- 4. Pour in the melted dark chocolate and stir again: this will make the mixture much more cohesive.
- 5. To make this step easier, put on a pair of those disposable vinyl gloves sold in hardware stores and supermarkets, pinch out small lumps of mixture and roll so that you have little rounds about the size of a chocolate truffle. You should get about 30 out of this mixture; fight the impatient urge to make these balls larger as you go.
- 6. Cover with clingfilm and slot into the fridge to firm up.
- 7. To decorate, melt the white chocolate either in a heatproof bowl suspended over a pan of simmering water, or in the microwave according to the manufacturer's guidelines, then let it cool for about 5 minutes, to make it easier to work with, while you chop the red cherries into small pieces (to evoke berries), and snip the green cherries (or angelica) into miniature lengths, to represent leaves.
- 8. Using a teaspoon, drip a little of the melted but slightly cooled white chocolate on each bonbon, then arrange the infuriatingly sticky pieces of cherry on top.
- 9. Place in boxes to give away if you use small boxes that will fit 6 bonbons each, you will get 5 adorable presents out of this or on a plate to hand round with coffee, instead of dessert, after a post-Christmas dinner.
