Port Welshpool & District Museum

Here's wishing one and all a happy and healthy 2025!

Port Welshpool has been abuzz over the last few weeks with the perfect fishing weather; the boat ramp has been queue after queue and the car park full to overflowing as the summer holidays are soaked up. Visitors have travelled from near and far to enjoy the great outdoors that this part of South Gippsland has to offer, and I must add, some battling the sand flies. And now with the "Rusty Gurnard" up and running all the support is wonderful to see, and how it has given the port a positive vibe. "Every town needs a pub".

With more families visiting the port, the Museum has been steady also with interested visitors. Many interested to learn the then and now of history of a fishing port, others searching for information on families that once called the area home. Many just love history.

SUTHERLAND is one of the well-known names of our area. Owners of many fine racehorses, [Epicmark and Paxarena to name two] an abattoir and the butcher's shop.

A recent member of the Sutherland family brought us back in time with memories of a fun filled childhood riding bikes and horses and the innocents of youth.

Jim Roberts also has a great memory of Mr. Arthur Sutherland. Even though Jim feared horses he remembers swimming racehorses for Mr Sutherland. With Jim in the security of the dinghy he rowed while Arthur held the horse on a rope, towing it along behind the dinghy until the horse swam faster than Jim could row, but with a gentle tap on the head from Arthur the horse would drop back. Many young local lads filled their love of horses helping at the stables and swimming the horses at the port.

A Sutherland landmark still stands proudly on the corner opposite the Welshpool pub where many a fine cut of meat was brought and enjoyed. Rob with his well-trained, experienced workers in their navy and white striped aprons with blood smears to show their handy work: sawdust shavings on the floor: and an ever-sharp knife, as the cut of meat was chosen. The Museum proudly has on display the wheel that was used to sharpen these knives. Home meat deliveries were for Port Welshpool on a Friday. As butcher shops are few and far between these days, we live with the memories of what once was and the Museum holds on proudly to these exhibits so in the future, generations can learn what once was and others can bask in the childhood memories.

Port Welshpool & District Bowling Club

We have officially unveiled the bowling green's new irrigation system.

Years of frustration due to the outdated and inefficient old overhead sprinkler system are over with the upgrade to a fully programmable pop-up irrigation system installed over the off-season.

A Community Bank Toora and Foster grant funded half of the project. A \$10k community grant from the South Gippsland Shire Council and club fund-raising funded the rest.

Jan Bull from the Community Bank and South Gippsland Shire Councillor, Scott Rae attended to witness the system in operation.





Welshpool Area Future Focus Group



Recently they conducted live on the water training exercises with air ambulance Victoria.


Given the water conditions and weather in Gippsland, this training is essential to maintain the skills required to support on water emergencies.


The practical exercises consist of a number of elements, including dropping life rafts and medics adjacent potential people in the water, winching medics and stretchers from a helicopter to a moving boat deck. 
Air Fryer Apple and Cinnamon Fritters

Ingredients

- ❖ 225g (1 1/2 cups) self-raising flour
- Pinch of salt
- ❖ 100g (1/2 cup) caster sugar
- ❖ 1 tsp ground cinnamon
- ❖ 125ml (1/2 cup) apple juice
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 2 eggs
- 2 pink lady apples, unpeeled, coarsely grated
- 50g butter,
- Melted Vanilla custard, to serve



Combine the *Flour, Salt, 50g Sugar and 1/2 tsp Cinnamon* in a large bowl. Make a well in the centre. Whisk *the juice, vanilla and eggs* in a jug until well combined. Pour *egg mixture* into *your mixture*. Stir until just combined (do not overmix). Stir in the *apple*. Step 2 Line the base of an air fryer basket with baking paper. Spoon 60ml (1/4 cup) of the batter onto the baking paper (depending on the size of your basket, you may t 2 or 3 fritters at a time. Do not overcrowd the pan, as they will expand while cooking). Spray with oil. Bake for 5 minutes at 200°C. Turn fritters. Bake for a further 5 minutes or until golden and cooked through. Repeat with remaining batter. Step 3 While the fritters are cooking, combine the remaining 50g sugar and 1/2 tsp cinnamon in a shallow bowl. Remove the fritters from the air fryer. Brush all over with melted butter. Dip fritters, one at a time, in cinnamon sugar. Turn to coat. Step 4 Serve the fritters immediately *with custard*, to dip.
