On Monday 24th June Mike and Julie from West Gippsland Libraries were very excited to announce the Welshpool Community Library NOW OPEN at the Rural Transaction Centre. With a collection of 1,000 items located in the branch, residents can borrow a variety of books, magazines, talking books, music CDs, DVDs, eBooks, and eAudiobooks. Titles can also be ordered from the online catalogue of more than 130,000 items and have them delivered to the Community Library.

The Library will be open five days a week from 11am to 4pm. A simple self-loan system is available during all opening hours and a phone is available to speak with a library officer.

Long Jetty Officially Open

On Friday 21st June the Port Welshpool Long Jetty was officially opened. A large crowd attended to witness this historic day.

The \$11,058,100 project was made possible with contributions of \$4,858,100 from the Federal Government, \$5,000,000 from the Victorian Government, \$1,000,000 from the South Gippsland Shire Council and \$200,000 from the Victorian Fishers Authority.

Pictured below, the cutting of the ribbon to officially re-open the Long Jetty was former Gippsland South MLA and Victorian deputy premier Peter Ryan, Gippsland Ports chief executive Chris Waites, former South Gippsland Shire mayor and councillor Jeanette Harding, former councillor Mike Wrigley, the Long Jetty Steering Committee's Paul MacPhail, Kath Hunt, current Gippsland South MLA Danny O'Brien and the Gunaikurnai Land and Waters Aboriginal Corporation's Grattan Mullett.

Since the unofficial opening in December many locals and visitors to the Shire have visited the Long Jetty with over 25,000 people having walked the jetty since February when counters were installed.

This was an exciting day for our local community and the wider South Gippsland Shire and we thank everyone who helped along the way in achieving this wonderful outcome.

Sharks.....What is nicer than a fresh piece of "flake"? If you're lucky enough to have had a good day out in Bass Strait, or from your local shop along with some crunchy chips and you can even add some salad. Mouth Watering? Mine is!

When the summer months arrive and the sea becomes so inviting, to cool down and relax, the word shark takes on another meaning. With all the enjoyment of a day spent at the beach we should exercise caution as we inhabit their home.

From the Museums Archives; I recently found this article published in "The Age, Dec 1943", and read it with great interest; I hope you enjoy it too.

When, fishing for shark was important for other reasons.

The article in part reads....Sharks Help War Effort".

Vitamin "A" and Cod Liver Oil.

A species of Australian shark which inhabit southern waters has help make a valuable contribution to the Commonwealth's war effort. It is reflected in the official interest now being displayed in the future of the local shark population in southern waters. It is a story of scientific research and resourceful commercial enterprise as a result of which has come as an oil possessed of vitamin A, vitamin concentrate was undertaken to facilitate the fortification of foodstuffs sent forward to the fighting services.

One authority associated with the commercial side of the industry yesterday expressed the view that suitable boats and adequate supplies of fuel should be released to fishermen, and that expert shark fishermen in the services should be released to return to the industry.

Fixed Price Aspect; another aspect raised yesterday was the question of prices. It was argued that in view of the national value of the shark and the fact that equipment and maintenance on the shark fishing industry were both more costly than in the case of other fishing off the coast, the shark fishermen were entitled to special consideration as an incentive. Consequently, it was stated, dismay had been occasioned among shark catchers by the action of the Prices Commissioner in reducing the retail price of flake as the same level as barracouta. In that the fisherman had the support of the commercial shark oil producers, who also pointed out that the production of oil did not run counter to the use of shark flesh as an edible commodity.

Earlier published in the Argus April 1941. "SHARK SELLS WELL."

Shark flesh is sold to restaurants and cafes. It pays the fishermen well and in addition, they are getting 8pence and 9 pence per pound for the liver, from which a substitute for cod-liver oil is made. The flesh from one large shark caught at Port Welshpool recently filled five boxes and the liver filled another – paying 2 pound for the liver alone.

And here we are many, many years later enjoying the great taste of fresh flake on our plates and many hideous memories of Cod Liver Oil. I wonder if shark oil had become as popular for all those cures known to mothers, would we have the same memories.




